Old St. Paul's Boy Killed

News has been received of the death from wounds in action of Private George Parry, of the South Lancs. Regt., on October 6, at the Clearing Station, France. Nineteen years of age, he joined the colours in February last, and had been seven weeks in France. He was educated at St. Paul's School, and formerly employed at Messrs. W. Vernon and Sons, flour millers. He was the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Evan Parry, 29, Albemarle Road, Seacombe.

The Sister in charge of the hospital writes that Private Parry (South Lancs.) was admitted severely wounded in the abdomen and although everything possible was done to relieve his condition he could not respond to his treatment and

passed away on October 6, a few hours after admission.
