News Report

Soldier's Death From Pneumonia

We regret to record the death of Pte. Arthur Mitchell Pascoe, 1-6 King's Liverpool Regt., when occurred on Dec. 18, at Bethnal Green Military Hospital, London. He was 32 years of age and joined the army in November, 1915, and was drafted to France at Christmas, 1916. He was wounded on September 20th and lost his left arm. He went up to London for the purpose of being fitted with an artificial chill, which developed into double pneumonia, death supervening. He was the only son of Mrs. Pascoe, and of the late Mr. James Pascoe, 56, formerly employed in the accountant's department of Messrs. Elder, Demspter, and Co., Ltd., Water Street, Liverpool.

Mr. J. Craig, managing director of the firm, writing to Mrs. Pascoe, says – "We are exceedingly grieved to learn of the death of your son, particularly as he was so soon to re-commerce his civil duties in our service. Prior to joining the army he had been with us for a considerable number of years, and always proved reliable and efficient in the carrying out of his work. We beg to tender you our deep sympathy with you in your bereavement."

The Funeral

The interment took place on Monday at Rake Lane Cemetery, prior to which a service was conducted at St. James' Church, New Brighton, by the Vicar, the Rev. Canon Stonex, Rural Dean, who also officiated at the graveside.
