Liscard Soldier's Death (January 1919)

Corpl. Charles Peers, 11th Cheshire Regt., who had been a prisoner of war at Cottbus, since April 10th of last year, was admitted on January 5th to the Lewisham Military Hospital very ill, and passed away on the 10th inst. of bronchial pneumonia. His neglect by the German authorities undoubtedly led to his death. He joined the army in August, 1914, and was drafted to France the following year. He was formerly a plasterer by trade. He leaves a widow, who resides at 7, Tower Street, Liscard, and an only son, at sea, to mourn his loss.

The funeral takes places today (Saturday) with full military honours at Rake Lane Cemetery, preceded by a service at St. Mary's Church at 2 p.m.
