## Two Killed And One Missing

Private <u>Thomas Herbert Potter</u>, of the Wallasey Pals, the fifth son of Mr. and Mrs James Potter, 34, Rankin Street, Poulton, was killed in action on July  $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ . He was educated at St. George's Road Council School and was employed on the Wirral Railway. He was 21 years of age and played football for the Poulton Rovers F.C.

**Private James Potter**, of the same regiment, the third son of Mr. and Mrs. James Potter, and the husband of Mrs. Mary Potter, Rosalind Street, Poulton, is also reported killed in action. He was 28 years of age.

A third son of Mr. Potter, Private Charles Potter, of the King's Liverpool Regiment, is said to be missing, and the parents have not heard from him for five

Pte. James Potter, of the Cheshire Regt., who was reported missing on July 14, 1916, has now been officially posted as killed in action.
