Rifleman Killed

Rifleman Richard Woolley Potter, K.L.R., nephew of Mr and Mrs Lancaster, and brother of Miss Edie Potter, of 9 Sandheys Road, Wallasey, was killed in action on August 17th. He was twenty-five years of age, and enlisted in the Lancashire Hussars, in May 1915. After spending some time at the Curragh Camp, Ireland, he was sent to France in January 1916, where he was later transferred to the King's Liverpool Regiment. Before the war he was employed by Messrs. Elder, Dempster and Co., Ltd., Liverpool. His cousin, Rifleman John C. Potter, K.L.R., has been missing for two years.
