

News Report

He Toll Of War

The name of Private Christopher W. Price, of the 3rd Cheshire Regiment, has now to be added to the sadly-growing list of Wallasey men who have fallen on the battlefield. News of his death has just been received by his wife at 98, Gladstone Road, Seacombe.

Private Price received wounds in the abdomen on the 4th March, and died three days later in the field hospital. The intimation that he had been wounded and the War Office notification of death arrived at his home by the same post.

Private Price, who was 36 years of age, enlisted in the 3rd Cheshires in August last [1914] and was almost immediately drafted to France, so that he had served practically from the opening of the campaign.

His experience in South Africa, where he fought for two years with the Imperial Yeomanry, enabled him to see service on the Continent so early in the present

war. In South Africa he was attached to Lord Methuen's column as bugler.

Sincere sympathy will be felt with his wife and young child.

His civilian occupation was that of a brick-setter, and a native of Wallasey, he enjoyed much popularity in the borough.
