News Report

Three Brothers

Lance-Corpl. Joseph Patrick Quinn was severely wounded on June 16, and four days later died at the Canadian Clearing Station, France. Only 18 years of age, he joined the Motor Transport in February, 1917, and was transferred to the Royal Fusiliers, being drafted to France last February. He was educated at St. Joseph's School, Seacombe and was the youngest son of Mrs. M.A. Quinn and of the late Mr. Francis Quinn, 68 Clarence Road, Seacombe.

The second son, Pte. Timothy Lawrence Quinn, Cheshire Regt., was admitted to the Alexandria Military Hospital last January suffering from septic poisoning, and lost the top of his thumb. No news has been heard of him since. He enlisted in the early part of 1915 and was sent to Egypt. Any news concerning him will be gratefully received by his mother.

Pte. Peter Francis Quinn, third son, was severely wounded in April by shrapnel in the right wrist, and is lying in the County of Middlesex War Hospital, Napsbury, near London. He joined up with the Territorials and was drafted to France in

October, 1914. Another son is in the Navy.
