The flag at the Liverpool Cotton Exchange floated at half-mask during the early part of the week in memory of Corporal Reginald Roberts, the only son of Mr and Mrs A. Roberts , of 4 Greenheys Road, Wallasey, who was employed by K. Galle and Co., cotton brokers, and was killed in action on April 18th. He was educated at St. Francis Xavier's, and enlisted in the Liverpool Pals at the outbreak of war, having served two years in France and being wounded last April. Corporal Roberts, who was 21 years of age, had returned to the front only three weeks ago.
